ATHLETE CODE of CONDUCT

As a member of the Mt Washington Freestyle Club (MWFC) and BC Freestyle athletes must meet certain expectations. This will ensure that participants are safe, have equal opportunity to learn, and above all have fun.

Athlete Conduct

As a member of MWFC each athlete is a role model for the rest of the Club and Team. As well they are representatives of Mount Washington Alpine Resort, their community and themselves as athletes. While training or competing at Mount Washington Alpine Resort as well as training and competing at other Resorts the Team is expected to maintain a level of behaviour that is exemplary and beyond reproach at all times.

- > The consumption of alcohol and/or any banned or illegal substances is prohibited
- > Dishonourable behavior of any kind towards other team members, coaches, officials, sponsors, parents, staff, or other teams and/or individuals is unacceptable. This would include but are not limited to: name-calling, bullying, exclusionary attitudes, oppositional and/or unsafe behaviours, or disrespect of any kind (including posting derogatory comments about individuals, the Club, or Mount Washington Alpine resort on social media).

Participation

It is expected that all members will participate fully in the program including:

- Participate in all scheduled training days, camps and scheduled away competitions that are part of their program
- Athletes will assist with course preparation including set-up and take down as required or instructed by the Coach or Course Officials
- Be available for any authorized promotional opportunities such as photo shoots, press releases, sponsorship or other media coverage
- Parent participation is mandatory for this club to be successful. Parents will be required to volunteer for no less than three volunteer shifts in order to receive their volunteer payment back at the end of the season. (see Volunteer duty schedule attached)

- Athletes under the age of 12 must be provided with lunchtime supervision and will not be released unless the parent/guardian is present at the end of the day.
- ❖ Behaviours that are considered disruptive to the safety and learning of other athletes and troublesome to the coaches (noncompliance, peer conflict, and unsafe behaviours) will result in a phone call to the parent for a supervised break until lunchtime. A second incident will result in a break for the rest of the day.
- More serious behaviours (include, but are not limited to; violence, threats, substance use, insubordination, noncompliance, etc.) that impact the safety of the athlete or others, and/or result in a disruption to coaching) will result in possible short term or long-term suspension or being dropped from the program. The nature of the consequence will be made through a formal review by the board of directors and the lead coaching staff. Parents will be notified in person and in writing as to the incident and outcome..
